This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board for Professional Engineers, 9 Land Surveyors, and Geologists. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for 10 Complainant and the staff of the Board for Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors, and 11 Geologists may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and settlement, 12 without notice to or participation by Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent 13 14 understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation 15 as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or 16 effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, 17 and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter. 18 19 13. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order, including PDF and facsimile 20signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals. 21 14. 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#### **DISCIPLINARY ORDER**

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Civil Engineer License No. C 26317 issued to Respondent Frank Joseph Mungia is revoked. However, the revocation is stayed and Respondent is placed on probation for two (2) additional years. The probationary period is in addition to the probationary period Respondent is currently serving. The terms and conditions for the original probationary period remain the same. The terms and conditions for the extended two year probationary period are as follows:

1. Engineering Coursework. Within eighteen (18) months from the effective date of 11 the decision, Respondent shall successfully complete and pass, with a grade of "C" or better, two 12 (2) college-level civil engineering courses, which must be related to the areas of violation alleged 13 14 in Accusation No. 1067-A. Said courses shall be approved in advance by the Board or its designee. The Respondent shall provide the Board with official proof of completion of the 15 requisite courses. For purposes of this condition, "college-level course" shall mean a course 16 offered by a community college or a four-year university of three semester units or the equivalent; 17 "college-level course" does not include seminars. Failure to provide the Board with official proof 18 of completion of the requisite courses at least six (6) months prior to the end of the probation 19 period will constitute a violation of probation. 20

Within 60 days from the effective date of the decision, Respondent shall submit proposed
courses that meet the educational requirements to the Board or its designee and have the courses
approved by the Board or its designee. Failure to submit and obtain Board approval of said
courses within the 60 days will constitute a violation of probation.

2. Ethics Exam. Within one (1) year from the effective date of the decision, the
 Respondent shall successfully complete and pass a course in professional ethics. The Respondent
 shall successfully complete and pass the Advanced Level Study (90 PDH) course of the
 Comprehensive Levels of Professional Development Hours in Engineering Ethics via Distance

Learning as offered by the Murdough Center for Engineering Professionalism, Texas Tech 1 2 University, or an equivalent professional ethics course that has been approved in advance by the Board or its designee. Failure to provide the Board with official proof of completion of the 3 requisite courses at least one (1) year prior to the end of the probation period will constitute a 4 5 violation of probation. Within 60 days from the effective date of the decision, Respondent shall provide proof of 6 enrollment of said ethics course to the Board. Failure to provide said proof of enrollment within 7 the 60 days will constitute a violation of probation. 8 9 3. **Obey All Laws.** The Respondent shall obey all laws and regulations related to the practices of professional engineering and professional land surveying. 10 4. **Submit Reports.** The Respondent shall submit such special reports as the Board may 11 require. 12 5. Tolling of Probation. The period of probation shall be tolled during the time the 13 Respondent is practicing exclusively outside the state of California. If, during the period of 14 probation, the Respondent practices exclusively outside the state of California, the Respondent 15 shall immediately notify the Board in writing. 16 6. Violation of Probation. If the Respondent violates the probationary conditions in any 17 respect, the Board, after giving the Respondent notice and the opportunity to be heard, may 18 vacate the stay and reinstate the disciplinary order which was stayed. If, during the period of 19 probation, an accusation or petition to vacate stay is filed against the Respondent, or if the matter 20has been submitted to the Office of the Attorney General for the filing of such, the Board shall 21 have continuing jurisdiction until all matters are final, and the period of probation shall be 22 extended until all matters are final. 23 24 7. Completion of Probation. Upon successful completion of all of the probationary conditions and the expiration of the period of probation, the Respondent's license shall be 25 unconditionally restored. 26 8. Notification. Within 30 days of the effective date of the decision, the Respondent 27 shall provide the Board with evidence that he has provided all persons or entities with whom he 28 5

1	has a contractual or employment relationship such that the relationship is in the area of practice of			
2	professional engineering and/or professional land surveying in which the violation occurred with			
3	a copy of the decision and order of the Board and shall provide the Board with the name and			
4	business address of each person or entity required to be so notified. During the period of			
5	probation, the Respondent may be required to provide the same notification of each new person			
6	or entity with whom he has a contractual or employment relationship such that the relationship is			
7	in the area of practice of professional engineering and/or land surveying in which the violation			
8	occurred and shall report to the Board the name and address of each person or entity so notified.

4	4. Accusation No. 1067-A was filed before the Board for Professional Engineers, Land			
5	Surveyors, and Geologists (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, and is currently pending			
6	against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly			
7	served on Respondent on May 8, 2014. Respondent timely filed his Notice of Defense contesting			
8	the Accusation.			
9	5. A copy of Accusation No. 1067-A is attached as exhibit A and incorporated herein by			
10	reference.			
11	ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS			
12	6. Respondent has carefully read, and understands the charges and allegations in			
13	Accusation No. 1067-A. Respondent has also carefully read, and understands the effects of this			
14	Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order.			
15	7. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a			
16	hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel at			
17	his own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to			
18	present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel			
19	the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and			
20	court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California			
21	Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.			
22	8. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and			
23	every right set forth above.			
24	CULPABILITY			
25	9. Respondent understands and agrees that the charges and allegations in Accusation			
26	No. 1067-A, if proven at a hearing, constitute cause for imposing discipline upon his Civil			
27	Engineer License.			
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10. For the purpose of resolving the Accusation without the expense and uncertainty of further proceedings, Respondent agrees that, at a hearing, Complainant could establish a factual basis for the charges in the Accusation, and that Respondent hereby gives up his right to contest those charges.

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11. Respondent agrees that his Civil Engineer License is subject to discipline and he agrees to be bound by the Board's probationary terms as set forth in the Disciplinary Order below.

#### CONTINGENCY

This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board for Professional Engineers, 12. 9 Land Surveyors, and Geologists. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for 10 Complainant and the staff of the Board for Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors, and 11 Geologists may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and settlement, 12 without notice to or participation by Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent 13 understands and agrees that he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation 14 prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation 15 as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or 16 effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, 17 and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter. 18

13. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile
 copies of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order, including PDF and facsimile
 signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

14. This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order is intended by the parties to be an
integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement.
It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions,
negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary
Order may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a
writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

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15. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Disciplinary Order:

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#### DISCIPLINARY ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Civil Engineer License No. C 26317 issued to
 Respondent Frank Joseph Mungia (Respondent) is revoked. However, the revocation is stayed
 and Respondent is placed on probation for five (5) years on the following terms and conditions.
 Civil Engineer License, No. C 26317, issued to Frank Joseph Mungia, is revoked; however,
 the revocation shall be stayed, and he shall be placed on probation for a period of five (5) years
 upon the following terms and conditions:

<u>Engineering Coursework.</u> Within four and one-half (4 ½) years from the effective
 date of the decision, the respondent shall successfully complete and pass two (2) college-level
 civil engineering courses, which must be related to the areas of violation alleged in the
 Accusation. Said courses shall be approved in advance by the Board or its designee. The
 respondent shall provide the Board with official proof of completion of the requisite courses. For
 purposes of this condition, "college-level course" means a course offered by a community college
 or a four-year university of three semester units or the equivalent; it does not include seminars.

<u>Ethics Exam.</u> Within four and one-half (4 ½) years from the effective date of the
 decision, the respondent shall successfully complete and pass a course in professional ethics. The
 respondent shall successfully complete and pass the Advanced Level Study (90 PDH) course of
 the Comprehensive Levels of Professional Development Hours in Engineering Ethics via
 Distance Learning as offered by the Murdough Center for Engineering Professionalism, Texas
 Tech University, or an equivalent professional ethics course that has been approved in advance by
 the Board or its designee.

3. <u>Cost Recovery.</u> Within four and one-half (4 ½) years from the effective date of the
decision, the respondent shall reimburse the Board for its investigative and enforcement costs in
this matter in the amount of \$3,880,00. Said reimbursement may be paid in installments.

4. Laws and Rules Exam. Within one hundred twenty (120) days from the effective date of the decision, the respondent shall successfully complete and pass the California Laws and Board Rules examination, as administered by the Board.

Client Notification. Within thirty (30) days from the effective date of the decision, 5. 4 the respondent shall provide the Board with evidence that he has provided all persons or entities 5 with whom he has a contractual or employment relationship relating to professional civil 6 engineering services with a copy of the decision and order of the Board and shall provide the 7 Board with the name and business address of each person or entity required to be so notified. 8 During the period of probation, the respondent may be required to provide the same notification 9 to each new person or entity with whom he has a contractual or employment relationship relating 10 to professional civil engineering services and shall report to the Board the name and address of 11 each person or entity so notified. 12

136.Obey Laws.The respondent shall obey all federal, state, and local laws and14regulations related to the practices of professional engineering and land surveying.

15 7. <u>Report to Board.</u> The respondent shall submit such special reports as the Board may
require.

8. <u>Out-of-State Practice.</u> The period of probation shall be tolled during the time the respondent is practicing exclusively outside the state of California. If, during the period of probation, the respondent practices exclusively outside the state of California, the respondent shall immediately notify the Board in writing.

9. **Probation Violation.** If the respondent violates the probationary conditions in any respect, the Board, after giving him notice and the opportunity to be heard, may vacate the stay and reinstate the disciplinary order which was stayed. If during the period of probation, an accusation or petition to vacate stay is filed against the respondent, or if the matter has been submitted to the Office of the Attorney General for the filing of such, the Board shall have continuing jurisdiction until all matters are final, and the period of probation shall be extended until all matters are final.

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License Restoration. Upon successful completion of all of the probationary
 conditions and the expiration of the period of probation, the respondent's Civil Engineer License,
 No. C 26317, shall be unconditionally restored.

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#### ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order. I understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my Civil Engineer License. 20	1. Richard B. Moore, PLS (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in his official
21	capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board for Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors, and

23	2. On or about March 10, 1976, the Board for Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors,
24	and Geologists issued Civil Engineer License Number C 26317 to Frank Joseph Mungia
25	(Respondent). The Civil Engineer License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the
26	charges brought herein and will expire on March 31, 2016, unless renewed.
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1	JURISDICTION
2	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board for Professional Engineers, Land
3	Surveyors, and Geologists (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the
4	following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise
5	indicated.
6	4. Section 118, subdivision (b), of the Code provides that the suspension, expiration,
7	surrender and/or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed
8	with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored,
9	reissued or reinstated.
10	5. Section 6775 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that "[T]he board may reprove,
11	suspend for a period not to exceed two years, or revoke the certificate of any professional
12	engineer registered under this chapter:
13	"(a) Who has been convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions
14	and duties of a registered professional engineer, in which case the certified record of conviction
15	shall be conclusive evidence thereof.
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17	"(c) Who has been found guilty by the board of negligence or incompetence in his or her
18	practice.
19	"(d) Who has been found guilty by the board of any breach or violation of a contract to
20	provide professional engineering services.

22	6. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 419, provides in pertinent part that
23	the Board may discipline a licensee for violations of Code section 6775 by subjecting their license
24	to specific probationary terms and conditions.
25	COST RECOVERY
26	7. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the
27	administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of
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the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and 1 enforcement of the case. 2 FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 3 (Negligence) 4 8. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 6775, subdivision (c), in 5 conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 419, in that Respondent was 6 negligent in his practice of professional engineering. The circumstances are set forth below. 7 On or about March 21, 2009, Respondent entered into a contract with Anacapa a. 8 Acquisitions, LLC ("Anacapa"), to provide engineering services which called for the preparation 9 of subdivision improvement plans and a final map for submittal to and approval by the City of 10 11 Victorville, California. Said contract stated that time was of the essence and called for Respondent's work to begin immediately. 12 b. Respondent failed to produce the plans and maps in a timely manner and, throughout 13 the course of his work on the project, repeatedly missed promised deadlines for submitting maps 14 and plans to the City of Victorville. More than two years after the contract had been executed, 15 the improvement plans prepared by Respondent remained very preliminary (less than 50%) 16 complete) and lacked the details necessary for checking, approval or construction. For example, 17 the plans contained the following deficiencies: (1) the storm drainage plan failed to show pipe 18 sizes or elevations for the catch basin laterals, and no pipe sizing calculations were included; (2) 19 rim and invert elevations were missing from the catch basins; (3) the sewer plans were missing 20 21 quantities on sheet 1 of 5; (4) the profile of other utilities were not shown in the sewer profile 22 drawing to indicate potential crossing conflicts; (5) sewer lines shown in plan view were not shown in the corresponding profile view; (6) the rough grading plan was incomplete for 23 construction, did not include lot pad grades and showed 16,200 cubic yards of fill to complete, 24 which was excessive for the site; (7) the street improvement and lighting plan was missing street 25 26 light locations, signs and ADA ramps; and (8) the profile sheets have three different profiles shown for the same street instead of one. 27 111 28 3

1	c. In June 2010, Respondent received \$35,000 from Anacapa. Said funds were not
2	provided to Respondent as payment for services rendered but were instead to be held in trust by
3	Respondent and used for project submittal and processing fees required by the City of Victorville
4	Respondent failed to use said funds for the specified purposes and was unwilling or unable to
5	return the funds to Anacapa upon demand some ten months later. Ultimately, Anacapa was forced
6	to file a civil lawsuit against Respondent in June 2012 in order to obtain restitution of the funds.
7	SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
8	(Breach/Violation of Contract)
9	9. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 6775, subdivision (d), in
10	conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 419, in that Respondent
11	breached and/or violated the terms of a contract to provide professional engineering services.
12	Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the allegations set forth above in

14	THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
15	(Criminal Conviction)
16	10. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 6775, subdivision (a), in
17	conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 419, in that Respondent was
18	convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions and duties of a licensed
19	professional engineer. The circumstances are as follows:
20	a. In May 2000, following a jury trial in the criminal proceeding entitled <i>United States</i>
21	v. Frank Mungia, No. CR 00-30-WJR (C.D. Cal., 2000), Respondent was found guilty and
22	convicted of nine (9) felony counts of violating U.S. Code, title 18, section 1343 [wire fraud] and
23	four (4) felony counts of violating U.S. Code, title 18, section 1957 [transactions in excess of
24	\$10,000 in criminally derived property]. On or about August 31, 2000, Respondent was
25	sentenced to 37 months in federal prison, fined and ordered to pay more than \$500,000 in
26	restitution.
27	b. The circumstances surrounding Respondent's convictions are that Respondent
28	engaged in a scheme to defraud individuals out of hundreds of thousands of dollars by falsely

1	representing that, for a fee, he and his company would provide the individuals with access to
2	millions of dollars in funds on deposit at a legitimate bank when, in fact, said bank was a bogus
3	entity with no deposits on hand which Respondent had created for the purpose of carrying out his
4	fraudulent scheme.
5	PRAYER
6	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
7	and that following the hearing, the Board for Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors, and
8	Geologists issue a decision:
9	1. Revoking or suspending Civil Engineer License Number C 26317, issued to Frank
10	Joseph Mungia;
11	2. Ordering Frank Joseph Mungia to pay the Board for Professional Engineers, Land
12	Surveyors, and Geologists the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case,
13	pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3;
14	3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
