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18 **FINDINGS OF FACT**

19 1. On or about March 17, 2010, Complainant David E. Brown, in his official capacity as  
20 the Executive Officer of the Board for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors, Department  
21 of Consumer Affairs, filed Petition to Revoke Probation No. 680-A against Walid A. Hneiti  
22 (Respondent) before the Board for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors.

23 2. On or about June 9, 1995, the Board for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors  
24 (Board) issued Electrical Engineer License No. E 15048 to Respondent. The Electrical Engineer  
25 License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will  
26 expired on December 31, 2009, and has not been renewed.

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1       3.     On or about April 5, 2010, Sylvia Reyes, an employee of the Department of Justice,  
2     served by Certified and First Class Mail a copy of the Petition to Revoke Probation No. 680-A,  
3     Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery, and Government Code  
4     sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7 to Respondent's address of record with the Board, which  
5     was and is:

6       P.O. Box 2925  
7       Amman 11821, Jordan.

8       A copy of the Petition to Revoke Probation is attached as exhibit A, and is incorporated  
9     herein by reference.

10      4.     Service of the Petition to Revoke Probation was effective as a matter of law under the  
11     provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c).

12      5.     On or about July 27, 2010, the aforementioned documents were returned by the U.S.  
13     Postal Service marked "Unclaimed."

14      6.     Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:

15         (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent  
16         files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts  
17         of the accusation not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall  
18         constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion  
19         may nevertheless grant a hearing.

20      7.     Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon him  
21     of the Petition to Revoke Probation, and therefore waived his right to a hearing on the merits of  
22     Petition to Revoke Probation No. 680-A.

23      8.     California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part:

24         (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the  
25         hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions  
26         or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to  
27         respondent.

28      9.     Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds  
Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the  
evidence on file herein, finds that the allegations in Petition to Revoke Probation No. 680-A are  
true.

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1           10. The total cost for investigation and enforcement in connection with the Petition to  
2 Revoke Probation are one thousand eight hundred seventy-five dollars and no cents (\$1,875.00).

3                                   **DETERMINATION OF ISSUES**

4           1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Walid A. Hneiti has subjected  
5 his Electrical Engineer License No. E 15048 to discipline.

6           2. A copy of the Petition to Revoke Probation is attached.

7           3. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.

8           4. The Board for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors is authorized to revoke  
9 Respondent's Electrical Engineer License based upon the following violations alleged in the  
10 Petition to Revoke Probation:

11           a. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because he violated a probationary  
12 condition by failing to comply with Probation Condition 1, giving the Board the right to  
13 vacate the stay and reinstate the disciplinary order that was stayed pursuant to Probation  
14 Condition 6. Specifically, Respondent failed to comply with the Board's probation  
15 terms and regulations related to the practices of professional engineering and land  
16 surveying.

17           b. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because he violated a probationary  
18 condition by failing to comply with Probation Condition 5, giving the Board the right to  
19 vacate the stay and reinstate the disciplinary order that was stayed pursuant to Probation  
20 Condition 6. Specifically, Respondent failed to complete and pass a course in  
21 professional ethics within the required time period.

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**ORDER**

IT IS SO ORDERED that Electrical Engineer License No. E 15048, heretofore issued to Respondent Walid A. Hneiti, is revoked.

Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute.

This Decision shall become effective on December 24, 2010.

19 **PARTIES**

20 1. David E. Brown (Complainant) brings this Petition to Revoke Probation solely in his  
21 official capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board for Professional Engineers and Land  
22 Surveyors, Department of Consumer Affairs (Board).

23 2. On or about June 9, 1995, the Board issued Electrical Engineer License No. E-15048  
24 to Walid A. Hneiti (Respondent). Effective August 23, 1999, through September 27, 2007, the  
25 license was revoked. Effective September 28, 2007, the license was reinstated, immediately  
26 revoked, revocation stayed, and Respondent placed on probation for a period of two (2) years  
27 pursuant to certain terms and conditions. The license expired on December 31, 2009, and has not  
28 been renewed.

3. In a disciplinary action entitled "In the Matter of the Accusation Against: Walid A. Hneiti," Case No. 680-A, the Board issued a Default Decision and Order, effective August 23, 1999, in which Respondent's Electrical Engineer License was revoked. A copy of that decision is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

4. In a disciplinary action entitled "In the Matter of the Petition for Reinstatement of Revoked License of: Walid A. Hneiti," Case No. 680-A, OAH No. N2007060346, the Board issued a Decision, effective September 28, 2007, in which Respondent's Electrical Engineer License was revoked. However, the revocation was stayed and Respondent was placed on probation for a period of two (2) years with certain terms and conditions. A copy of that decision is attached as Exhibit B and incorporated by reference.

## JURISDICTION

5. This Petition to Revoke Probation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.

## STATUTORY PROVISIONS

6. Section 118, subdivision (b), provides that the suspension, expiration, surrender or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued or reinstated.

7. Section 6775 states, in pertinent part, that "[t]he board may reprove, suspend for a period not to exceed two years, or revoke the certificate of any professional engineer registered under this chapter. . ."

## PROBATION TERMS

8. Among the terms and conditions imposed by the Board Case No. 680-A, OAH No. N2007060346, are:

1. Petitioner shall obey all laws and regulations related to the practices of professional engineering and land surveying.
5. Petitioner shall successfully complete and pass a course in professional ethics. No later than 60 days before the end of the probationary period, petitioner shall

1 successfully complete and pass the 40-hour course, "Intermediate Studies in  
2 Engineering Ethics" (ENG ETHICS PDH-40), offered by the Murdough Center for  
3 Engineering Professionalism, College of Engineering, Texas Tech University.

4 6. If petitioner violates the probationary conditions in any respect, the board, after  
5 giving petitioner notice and the opportunity to be heard, may vacate the stay and  
6 reinstate the disciplinary order that was stayed. If during the period of probation an  
7 accusation or petition to vacate stay is filed against petitioner, or if the matter has  
8 been submitted to the Office of the Attorney General for the filing of such, the board  
9 shall have continuing jurisdiction until all matters are final, and the period of  
10 probation shall be extended until all matters are final.

11 9. In a letter to the Attorney General's Office dated September 24, 2009, the Board

15 10. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because he violated a probationary

17 the stay and reinstate the disciplinary order that was stayed pursuant to Probation Condition 6.  
18 Specifically, Respondent failed to comply with the Board's probation terms and regulations  
19 related to the practices of professional engineering and land surveying, as set forth below.

20 **SECOND CAUSE TO REVOKE PROBATION**

21 **(Failure to Complete Ethics Course)**

22 11. Respondent's probation is subject to revocation because he violated a probationary  
23 condition by failing to comply with Probation Condition 5, giving the Board the right to vacate  
24 the stay and reinstate the disciplinary order that was stayed pursuant to Probation Condition 6.  
25 Specifically, Respondent failed to complete and pass a course in professional ethics within the  
26 required time period.

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**PRAYER**

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board issue a decision:

**DECISION**

This matter was heard before the Board for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors in Oakland, California, on July 26, 2007. The board members present were Richard Lyons, President; Patrick Tami, Vice President; Kim Blackseth; Dr. Gregg Brandow; Arthur Duffy; James Foley; Robert L. Jones; Mike Modugno; and Ray Satorre. Michael C. Cohn, Administrative Law Judge, State of California, Office of Administrative Hearings, presided.

Rita Lane, Deputy Attorney General, represented the Department of Justice, Office of the Attorney General.

Petitioner represented himself.

**FACTUAL FINDINGS**

1. Petitioner Walid A. Hnieti was issued electrical engineer license number E-15048 on June 9, 1995. Effective August 23, 1999, petitioner's license was revoked in a default decision and order issued by the board upon findings that petitioner had been convicted of a felony violation of Penal Code section 424 (embezzlement by a public officer), a crime involving deceit, misrepresentation and fraud.

2. On April 16, 2007, petitioner filed this petition for reinstatement of his revoked license.

3. Following his criminal conviction in 1997, petitioner was placed on three years' criminal probation. As part of that probation he completed a one-year rehabilitation and counseling program at Gateways Hospital and Mental Health Center in Los Angeles. After completing that program, petitioner, who has been a licensed electrical engineer in

Jordan since 1992, returned to that nation. He was permitted to serve the balance of his criminal probation in Jordan. Petitioner subsequently successfully completed that probation.

4. Since March 1999, petitioner has been employed as a senior electrical engineer at the Central Bank of Jordan. His duties include the development, operation, and maintenance of low current security projects: CCTV, intrusion detection, access control, turnstile security doors, and addressable fire alarm systems. This position requires petitioner to have a top security clearance in Jordan. He concedes, however, that he did not advise his employers of his conviction in California when he applied for his position and received his security clearance.

5. In February 2007, petitioner completed a Ph.D. program in computer science at Amman Arab University for Graduate Studies, achieving a 3.9 grade point average. Petitioner has also successfully completed a number of computer-related seminars and technical training programs, and in July 2007 received a Cisco certification.

6. Petitioner has no current plans to return to California to practice as a professional engineer. However, he might change his plans in the future, and he would like to have his license reinstated partly for that reason and partly because he is troubled by the fact he has a revoked license in a state and country he loves.

7. Petitioner exhibited remorse for his criminal conduct, he demonstrated that he has turned his life around since that conviction, and he showed that he takes his license seriously enough to have undertaken rehabilitative efforts to prepare for this petition. However, the one area in which petitioner's rehabilitation has some deficiencies is in the area of ethics; the board has some concern over petitioner's failure to reveal his conviction when he sought employment in Jordan.

### LEGAL CONCLUSIONS

Petitioner has established to the satisfaction of the board that cause exists for reinstatement of his revoked license upon probationary conditions. Those conditions must include successful completion of both a 40-hour course in ethics and the board's "take-home exam" on engineering laws and rules. Because petitioner is residing in Jordan and has no immediate plans to return to California, the standard condition tolling probation while practicing outside California is not imposed. However, should he return to California to practice as a professional engineer during his period of probation, petitioner shall be required to immediately notify the board.

### ORDER

The petition of Walid A. Hniet for reinstatement of his revoked license is granted. Electrical engineer license number E-15048 is reinstated. The license shall be immediately revoked, the order of revocation stayed, and petitioner placed on probation for two years on the following conditions:

1. Petitioner shall obey all laws and regulations related to the practices of professional engineering and land surveying.
2. Petitioner shall submit such special reports as the board may require.
3. If petitioner returns to practice professional engineering in California during the probationary period, he shall immediately (within 15 days) notify the board in writing.
4. Within 60 days of the effective date of this decision, petitioner shall successfully complete and pass the California Laws and Board Rules examination, as administered by the board.
5. Petitioner shall successfully complete and pass a course in professional ethics. No later than 60 days before the end of the probationary period, petitioner shall successfully complete and pass the 40-hour course, "Intermediate Studies in Engineering Ethics" (ENGR ETHICS PDH-40), offered by the Murdough Center for Engineering Professionalism, College of Engineering, Texas Tech University.
6. If petitioner violates the probationary conditions in any respect, the board, after giving petitioner notice and the opportunity to be heard, may vacate the stay and reinstate the disciplinary order that was stayed. If during the period of probation an accusation or petition to vacate stay is filed against petitioner, or if the matter has been submitted to the Office of the Attorney General for the filing of such, the board shall have continuing jurisdiction until all matters are final, and the period of probation shall be extended until all matters are final.
7. Upon successful completion of all the probationary conditions and the expiration of the probationary period, petitioner's license shall be unconditionally restored.
